#### FROM THE RECTOR: THE PASCHAL MYSTERY

On New Year's Day the baseball movie, *Bull Durham*, was playing on the television. I hadn't seen the movie in years and enjoyed watching it, as if for the first time. There was a great scene midway through the movie on the team's tour bus: the young star pitcher, named Nuke, was playing guitar and singing *Try a little tenderness* by Otis Reading. Nuke didn't know the words and kept singing "woolly" instead of "weary" and "stress" instead of "dress". He sang until the veteran catcher, Crash, snatched the guitar from him and said: "I hate people who get the words wrong. It ain't *woolly* it's *weary* and it nobody's got *stress*, they're wearing a *dress...*" What we say matters. A song sung with the wrong words looses much (or all) of its original meaning. I wonder if that is any different than singing a song and never once taking time to consider what the words of the song are saying. A tune, as great and familiar as one might be, is only part of a song when words are involved. For example, Handle's Messiah is a great piece of music, but the point of that music is expressed in the words that are being sung. Without the words, the meaning is lost.

I've been paying more attention to the words of hymns lately. I wrote last month about some of the great Advent hymns. Over Christmastide, I noticed that most of Christmas hymns are not focused exclusively on Christmas. A number of them work better lyrically

moving into Epiphany (for example *The First Nowell* and *What Child is this* both transition quickly from the manger to the magi), while others climax in a celebration of the Paschal Mystery:

Mild he lays his glory by, born that we no more may die, born to raise us from the earth, born to give us second birth. Risen with healing in his wings, light and life to all he brings, hail, the Sun of Righteousness! hail, the heaven-born Prince of Peace! (from Hark the herald angels sing)

God comes down that we may rise, lifted by him to the skies; Christ is born for us that we born again in him may be. (from Sing, O sing, this blessed morn)

Then let us all with one accord sing praises to our heavenly Lord; that hath made heaven and earth of nought, and with his blood our life hath bought. (from *The first Nowell*)

The church year is rich with symbolism. In the midst of that symbolism, every Christian celebration, including Christmas and Epiphany, finds its meaning in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Many of the hymn writers took great care to point singers and hearers of those hymns toward Easter. Every celebration of the Holy Eucharist culminates in the Paschal Mystery. The words of the Holy Eucharist are the words we worship with, but they can also inform us about the faith we share. I am convinced that Christians learn through worship. Every now and again I think that it's important to recognize that fact and pay a bit more attention to some of the details.

A good new year's resolution might be to sing the words of each hymn with special care to understanding what the words are saying. Another great resolution might be to pray and hear the words of the Holy Eucharist with a newly tuned ear. In addition, I highly recommend carving out time once a week this winter to learn about the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Information on the class I will be offering is below.

## THE PASSION OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST: ADULT EDUCATION & CONFIRMATION CLASSES


Parts of the Gospel accounts of the Passion are read every year during Holy Week (Matthew, Mark & Luke are read in a three year cycle on Palm/Passion Sunday; John is read every year on Good Friday). The narratives of Jesus' death and resurrection are the heart of the Gospels. The texts are better, richer and more interesting than any movie.

This winter I will offer a ten-part class on the Passion Narratives in the Gospels. We will read and compare the narratives of Jesus' betrayal, trials, crucifixion and death found in the four Gospels. If you haven't had an opportunity yet to learn and study these essentials, this class is for you! This class will allow participants to read, mark, learn and inwardly digest all four narratives. The class will be offered on Sundays at 9:00 AM and again on Tuesdays at 6:00 PM (The Tuesday class will repeat what was covered on Sunday). This class is designed both for adults and also for young people who wish to be Confirmed by the Bishop in June.

This class is open to everyone. It is a great way for parents and their confirmation age children to learn about their faith together. It is a wonderful opportunity for people who recently discovered or rediscovered Christ to learn about their faith. It can serve as a helpful refresher for Christians who want to recharge their spiritual batteries. It is a fantastic way for any Christian to prepare for Holy Week & Easter. We begin on January 17 (repeated on January 19) and conclude March 21 (repeated on March 23). The class is being offered twice each week in the hopes that more people will be able to find a way to fit it into their schedules. Food and beverages are welcome at both classes.

#### 2010 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN

#### The Stewardship Committee

The 2010 Stewardship Campaign has gotten off to a wonderful start. As of today we have 29 signed pledges and 15 unsigned pledges for a total of \$80,694.00.

We are thrilled to report that we have already surpassed the amount pledged in 2009, however, there is some work left to do. Our goal for 2010 is \$120,000, the amount needed to balance the budget and ensure that we continue to keep Good Shepherd an open, staffed and active parish. We are 67.245% of the way toward our goal, which means that we still need to raise \$39,306 in pledges.

Day to day life at Good Shepherd is not supported by an endowment, but by the pledged giving of its members and friends. Good Shepherd needs and is grateful for your support this year.

If you have made a pledge in the past, please prayerfully consider making one this year. If you have never pledged before please know that a pledge is a commitment between yourself and God that supports and makes possible the day to day life of the church. If you are unsure of your own finances for 2010, please know that a pledge can be adjusted – just speak to the Financial Officer, Bob Bubeck – at any time. If you have already made a pledge, consider adjusting it to add \$5 or \$10 a week more, which will greatly help us toward our goal. We are confident that we can reach our goal if every member makes a pledge for 2010. Please prayerfully consider what you can do to keep Good Shepherd thriving. Thank you so much!
