

Rector's Remarks

Hello good people,

What do you think of when you hear the word "sanctuary"?

Birds? Holy space? Farm animals?

The word sanctuary is derived from the Latin sanctuarium, which is a vessel for safekeeping. Wildlife sanctuaries are well known, like the local Audubon sanctuaries, providing safekeeping for birds and other living creatures. Did you know farm-animal sanctuaries now exist, providing rescued livestock safety from abuse and starvation? Covenant House, a shelter program in New York and throughout the world, provides sanctuary to homeless youth so they can get their lives together and get back on their feet. (I worked there from 1989-1990 and it's an important ministry.)

Places of worship have always been sanctuaries, too, and this represents the sacred dimension of the word. Religious sanctuaries are places of safety, rest, and rejuvenation, where one can encounter the Holy.

Good Shepherd as sanctuary – as a place of safety, rest, and rejuvenation where one can slow down and encounter the Holy – has been on my mind a lot lately. Especially as the fabric of society seems to fray more and more weekly before our eyes. In such turbulent times, what is one to do? Where is one to go to find sustenance, support, and strength to endure?

Ancient Israel knew troubles (far greater than ours) and the psalmist sings their wisdom:

"In my distress I called upon the Lord; to my God I cried for help. From his temple he heard my voice, and my cry to him reached his ears" (Psalm 18:6).

"We have thought on your steadfast love, O God, in the midst of your temple" (Psalm 48: 9).

"The Lord is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, my God, my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold" (Psalm 18:2).

For those on the journey of faith, Sunday worship is a pit stop, a self-imposed time out, a short retreat from the torrent of daily life – a sanctuary, in other words – so we can access safety, rest, and rejuvenation through the Holy. It's vital that we not lose that sacred sense of church at Good Shepherd. It's vital – especially in these times – that we remain sanctuary for one another, with one another, and through one another as the Body of Christ.

Charitable Opportunities

If you have wandered into church during the week over the last month, I undoubtedly asked you your opinion about the level of the "ask fatigue" in the church. A growing number of people have been telling me for about a year that they feel accosted by too many requests here at church. It's feeling a bit too much, they have increasingly said. We have had great discussions about this at the vestry level and with a number of the ministry leaders, like Outreach, Sunday School, High School Group, Seniors, etc.

Here's the current majority opinion on this issue: 1) we are grateful for all the activity – in terms of ministries, events, and charitable opportunities - here at Good Shepherd and we don't want to see that decrease; 2) there also are a lot of asks that can take place on Sundays during announcements as a result of all that activity – join a group, take a bag, walk with us, donate a coat, buy a raffle ticket, etc. - and it is understandable that some could experience "ask fatigue" as a result. So, after much discussion and idea-sharing, here is how we are going to decrease the verbal asks at announcements without decreasing the ministries, events, or charitable opportunities themselves.

We've started using a table, like the one below, in our weekly service leaflet inserts so everyone can see what events and charitable opportunities are going on each month. The table will also be included in our monthly newsletter and posted on our bulletin boards. At announcements, we will verbally promote these opportunities less, referring you instead to this table in the insert, and we hope that will both bring these opportunities to your awareness as well as decrease the sense of being asked for things here often.

Also, don't forget: no one is expected to go to all the events we do at Good Shepherd. No one is expected to support all the charitable opportunities, either. Do what makes sense to you. Do what you can do, and no more. Also, rejoice – we do an enormous amount of good together. Thank you for that. And, as always, feel free to provide me and the wardens with feedback about these new strategies.


Update on our Oktoberfest Food Drive




Calling all Christmas elves!

Curious about...?

Here's a summary of our Confirmation Program, Journeying with God in Christ.

Designed by Dr. Fay Wright and The Rev. Hal Roark

The Goals and Methods of this Curriculum:

- The overall goal of this course is to help the confirmands deepen their relationship with God through Jesus Christ in a way that is personally relevant and meaningful to them.
- We provide the confirmands with information and opportunities necessary to make an informed decision about choosing to be confirmed, or not. The method is to provide basic information with discussion afterwards, exploring how these topics relate to the young adult's lives.
- We impart basic knowledge about key areas of Episcopal Christian life that provides a foundation for continued lifelong Christian growth. This areas include:
- 1. **Introduction**: to the course, one another, and the program for the year. A discussion of journey as a metaphor for life. What confirmation is (and is not). Also, an introduction to *The Book of Common Prayer* and its catechism. A review of basics about the *Bible*.
- 2. World Religions other than Christianity: can one journey with God through them? (Answer: yes). A discussion of what is distinctive about the Christian approach. (Answer: Journeying with God through a relationship with Jesus). What does that mean? What does that imply? Why is it important and relevant about that

relationship?

- 3. Jesus and the Old Testament: what's the relationship? What does this mean for us today? How do Episcopalians interpret the Bible? Why?
- 4. Jesus and the New Testament: what's the relationship? What does this mean for us today? How do we use this to interpret the Bible?
- 5. **Episcopal Worship**: why do we worship the way we do? What are the parts of Sunday worship? How can we get the most out of it?
- 6. **Christian Prayer**: what is it? (Answer: it's talking with and listening to God). How do Christians pray? Does God hear us? How do we know? And more.
- 7. Christian Spiritual Discernment: how do we identify our gifts and talents? Why are they important to develop? What role can mentors play? Mentor testimonials.
- 8. Christian Ethics: why is being loving so important in Christianity? How can we incorporate it regularly into our daily lives? The importance of Christian charity.
- 9. Christian Theology: what is it and how can it help us? How can it help us answer hard questions? For example, If God is good, why is there evil in the world? And more.
- 10. Making an informed choice: what does that mean? What's my choice as a young adult? Should I continue in my journey with God through Jesus? Should I choose to be confirmed? What is the confirmation ritual like? A runthrough in the church.

- 11. It is expected that the confirmands will attend all the **Holy Week services**: Maundy Thursday (April 18, 2019), Good Friday (April 19, 2019), and the Easter Vigil (April 20, 2019), including both the food celebrations and the worship services. Confirmation culminates in the Triduum: the Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil services.
- 12. Additionally, the students are also required to attend the **Yorktown Interfaith Prayer Service** in November.
- 13. Furthermore, there shall also be a one day retreat at **Holy Cross Episcopal Monastery** in the Hudson Valley on March 2 from 7:45 am to 3 pm.

Requirements:

- The program is open to all Good Shepherd 8th and 9th graders. It will be taught again in the fall of 2020. There is no homework to complete.
- The Confirmation Class shall meet on Sunday evenings from 5:00 to 7:00 pm at the rectory. It is co-led by Fr. Hal and Fay. We start and end on time. Thank you for being punctual.
- The dates for the 2018-2019 Confirmation class are October 14, Oct. 21, Nov. 18, Dec. 16, Jan. 27, 2019, Feb. 10, Feb. 24, Mar. 2, and Mar. 31. The Holy Week services are April 18, 19, and 20, 2019.
- Also, on Sunday, November 18, 2018 the confirmands will attend the annual Yorktown interfaith Prayer Service and then discuss the experience together afterwards over pizza. The hours for this meeting shall be shared with the confirmands and their families once the YIPC leaders decide where

and when the service will be this year.

- The March 2 date is a day trip to Holy Cross Episcopal Monastery in West Park, NY. We shall leave from Good Shepherd at 7:45 am and return at 3 pm. We shall drive the confirmands to and from We shall eat lunch at the the monastery. monastery and pray with the monks, as well as have private discussion time.
- The Confirmands are allowed only one excused absence. The confirmand must notify Fr. Hal by 11:30 am on the day that he/she will miss the class.
- We are waiting to hear from the diocese about a confirmation date, preferably on either May 19, 2019 (first choice) or May 5, 2019 (second choice). The service will be at 9 am on a Sunday morning, celebrated by one of our three bishops, and all are invited for the celebration. We shall share a date with you as soon as we receive one.
- There is a \$200 cost per confirmand to cover materials to be provided for this year-long course. Neither Hal nor Fay are paid for this ministry. The fee covers: 1) their own leather Prayer Book/Bible book, our text for the class, to be given to them at the first class; 2) food for 12 dinners; 3) gas for trips, etc. As always, financial support is available from Fr. Hal upon confidential request. Never hesitate to ask!
- During each meeting at the rectory, the confirmation group prepares and eats their dinner together and cleans up afterwards, all the while discussing the topics presented that evening for discussion and debate.
- We have fun and a good time together. After all, Christianity is about Good News and that includes making new friends and having laughs. Get excited! This is going to more fun than you realize.

We're a Benedictine Community in the Anglican Communion which includes The Episcopal Church. Holy Cross Monastery is part of the Order of the Holy Cross (OHC), founded by the Rev. James Otis Sargent Huntington in 1884. An active reformer on New York City's Lower East Side with an enduring sense of social responsibility, Fr. Huntington had both courage and foresight. He understood the role prayer and contemplation could play in sustaining social justice efforts. The earliest community moved to Maryland before settling in West Park in 1902. Today, our West Park monastery includes housing for male and female guests and the Monastery Church of St. Augustine, in addition to the Monastic Enclosure.

Because Fr. Huntington's vision as our community lived it was essentially Benedictine, we formally adopted the Rule of St. Benedict in 1984. Over the years, we've adapted the Rule to account for different settings as well as the demands of contemporary life. Our primary ministry is welcoming guests on individual and group retreats. We also operate a book and gift shop that features calligraphy, icons, incense, and photography created by our monks.




















Our Calendar of Events
