# **OUR WORSHIP**



Our weekly service on Sundays starts at 10:00AM and is also broadcast on via Zoom. The service begins with a short children's sermon after which the children move to Sunday School and return in time for Eucharist. The Coffee hour immediately following the service is our time to reconnect with our parish family each week. Whether it's sharing a simple cup of coffee or breakfast/desserts we value our time together.

Our traditions also include celebrations of major feast days: Candlemas, Annunciation, Easter Triduum,

Ascension Day, Holy Cross Day, Michaelmas, All Saints Day, and Twelfth Night. These Holy Day Eucharists are often preceded by sharing potluck dinners, desserts or just coffee & tea. We love to be together, sharing life with our parish family. The liturgical calendar gives us many opportunities to create and deepen our bonds, with God and each other.

# **OUR MINISTRIES**

**Pastoral Care & Prayer Group:** This team gives support by providing home and hospital visits, rides, meals, and actively prays daily for the confidential needs of our parishioners and friends. **Music Ministry:** We have an active choir, some of whom are musicians too and perform on most Sundays and holidays.

**WOCOGS:** The Women of the Church of the Good Shepherd is a fellowship group open to everyone. They help raise funds through plant and bake sales, etc. and also includes a birthday card ministry who send out cards to all parishioners.

**Financial Ministry:** We have a treasurer and financial secretary.

**Christian Education:** Sunday School is a joyous part of our church and is offered during the 10:00AM service year-round for ages Pre-K through 8th grade. The program is led by the Sunday School Committee, a group of parents, grandparents, and interested parishioners. The Sunday School sponsors a variety of fun events such as the Blessing of the Backpacks, St. Nicholas Visit, Christmas Pageant, Spring Concert, and Graduation and during the summer months we have Craft Sundays. We anticipate the ongoing development of the Sunday School – maintaining recent practices while also embracing gradual changes through collaboration.

# **OUTREACH**

We offer a wide range of programs that cater to the spiritual and social needs of our congregation and community. At our church we believe faith isn't just about Sunday services: it's about loving our neighbors, lifting each other up, and serving our community with open hearts.

#### **Food Ministries**

Twice a month a team of volunteers from other organizations along with our COGS volunteers gather in our COGS kitchen to prepare and serve a free hot lunch and delicious desserts to our local seniors. In addition, each attendee receives a take home dinner to enjoy later. It's gotten very popular with our seniors as we have an average of 50-60 attending most times. We also provide music and at times the seniors even get up and dance! Also, twice a month we make approximately 300 bag lunches which we deliver to two local food pantries.

# **Core Community Partners**

- Community Center of Northern Westchester (CCNW): A hub of emergency resources
  offering support to help our food insecure neighbors to enhance their wellbeing. We
  collect food weekly for CCNW and partnered with them to obtain a grant from Episcopal
  Charities.
- Putnam Northern Westchester Women's Resource Center: The center works to create a space and supportive environment that provides free and confidential services and support to victims of violence. During the year we collect items for the center such as baby items, women's toiletries and at Easter time we provide Easter baskets for the children. We also support their annual fund raiser and partnered with them to obtain a grant from Episcopal Charities.

# **BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS**

Good Shepherd is located on four acres of land in a residential neighborhood. The Church, Parish Office, Sacristy, Breezeway, Guild Room, and Parish Hall are in three interconnected buildings. A separate house located on one corner of the property serves as the Rectory, and a Memorial Garden is located in a wooded section of the property near the parking lot, behind the Church. The front lawn includes the bell and cornerstone from the original Chapel of the Good Shepherd, which no longer exists. The bell is rung to announce commencement of the 10:00AM service, provided the snow is not too deep to get to it! This is a nice connection to our past.

THE CHURCH was built in 1954, and the first service was held on Christmas Eve. A brick construction with a concrete interior. The Church seats a total of 200 people and is heated, but not air conditioned, with ceiling fans used for cooling. The Church has a small narthex with a small adjoining room used for Acolyte preparation. A focal point of our Church is a large, round stained-glass window over the altar depicting Jesus the Good Shepherd which was donated by parishioners in 1962. Our church walls are donned by the Stations of the Cross, donated by a parishioner.

THE PARISH HALL was built in 1956 and it's a large, multipurpose room used for Sunday school, coffee hour, church events and social gatherings. Like the Church, the Parish Hall is heated, but not air conditioned, with ceiling fans used for cooling in the summer. The Hall can accommodate 80 people at tables or 100 people with no tables. The Parish Hall has a few small rooms that are used for storage or as a meeting space. In the 1970's the Breezeway and Guild Room were built to connect the church with the Parish Hall and kitchen.



THE RECTORY is a wood framed Cape Cod style home located on church property but is situated apart from the Church buildings with its own driveway. The main level of the Rectory consists of a living room with hardwood floors and a fireplace, dining room, kitchen, master bedroom with a walk-in closet and master bathroom. There are also two additional bedrooms, and a full bath on the same level. It has a full basement with a one-car garage, washer/dryer, and utility space. Recently we upgraded to the Somers town water system. A/C is provided by window units.

THE MEMORIAL GARDEN was constructed in 2012 with donations from parishioners and can be accessed from the parking lot. To date, 12 interments have been made in the garden. A wooden



trail was created by a parishioner in Boy Scout Troop 376 as his Eagle Scout project that leads from the memorial garden to the church. Engraved bricks are sold to support the Memorial Garden and adorn the entry to the garden. Traditionally, we start our Palm Sunday and Memorial Day services in the garden with a procession to the church. In the past we have also held Evening Prayer and Stations of the Cross in the Memorial Garden as well, weather permitting. It is also a great place for meditation. Teens of our church also created a tiny lending book library for

children in the area and a garden for butterflies and plants.

# **Finances**

We are blessed with an endowment created by the estate of past parishioners. This fund is restricted and can only be used for operation when approved by a vote of the congregation. Our congregation unanimously approved using our Yandersitz Fund at a meeting in February 2025 as needed to cover shortfalls resulting from the additional expense of the joint rector. Based on our

best budgeting and estimates, the fund will enable us to cover our share of the joint rector for over three years, by which time it is our prayerful hope and expectation that we will be again able to maintain a balanced budget and in time replenish the fund to cover future emergencies.

## **OUR COMMUNITY**

Granite Springs is a hamlet in the town of Somers, NY located 50 miles north of midtown Manhattan (just over an hour by train), 25 miles north of White Plains, NY, and 35 miles west of Danbury, CT. The community surrounding Good Shepherd is a combination of suburban and

rural. The natural surroundings in and around Granite Springs are well worth exploring, and make a wonderful environment to settle down, build friendships, fellowship, and your relationship with God.

Somers is very family friendly with great public schools and many recreational activities for children. The <u>Somers Central School District</u> includes four schools on two campuses. School bus transportation is provided. The district's total enrollment in 2024 was 2635 students. The student ratio is 10:1. Consistent with the make-up of the town, racial diversity in the schools is limited, with 78.8% Caucasian, 4% Asian, 13.5% Hispanic or Latino, and 1.2% African American and 3.5% multiracial students. In 2024, Somers High School had a 95% graduation rate for students.

It is easy to get your children involved in a number of activities sponsored by the Town of Somers. The <u>Somers Youth Sports Organization</u> ("SYSO") offers low-cost baseball, softball, basketball, football, lacrosse, soccer, and cheerleading. Town residents generally join one of the lake communities in town or swim at a local health club.

Northern Westchester is a great location for those who enjoy spending time outdoors with several state, county and town parks offering walking, hiking and biking trails, as well as fishing in one of the area's many reservoirs. Lasdon Arboretum and Veterans Memorial, Muscoot Farm, and Reis Park are all located in Somers. Reis Park offers a playground, playing fields, tennis courts, and the Somers Library. Within walking distance of Good Shepherd is the North County Trailway, a 33-mile paved biking, walking, skating, and skiing trail.

Theatrical performances or concerts are offered at the <u>Caramoor Center for Music and the Arts</u> in Katonah, the <u>Yorktown Community Theater</u>, the <u>Schoolhouse Theater</u>, the <u>Hudson Valley Shakespeare Festival</u>, the <u>Katonah Museum of Art</u>, or at the <u>Katonah Art Center</u>.
